Welcome to what is surely going to be a very exciting school year! Stuyvesant opened its doors on September 12, 1904 to 155 boys and 12 faculty members. Today we have a wonderful student body of over 3000 boys and girls and a distinguished faculty that numbers more than 150.

On Sunday, October 19th, we will have our centennial kickoff event called the "Stuyvesant Strut." I encourage all of our community to join in this event that will begin at the "original" Stuyvesant building on East 15th Street and culminate with a special birthday celebration at the "new" Stuyvesant building on Chambers Street. This event will officially start our yearlong Centennial Celebration. We hope to involve as many students, teachers, teams, clubs, parents and alumni as possible in each Centennial event. We have several unique "happenings" planned for the 2003/2004 school year.

I anticipate a memorable academic year as we concentrate on the goals I outlined at the September faculty meeting. They are the improvement of instruction, the improvement of school tone, and the integration of technology into our instruction. The Department of Education is undergoing the most significant change in organization in 30 years. However, the reorganization of the Department of Education should have little or no effect on classroom instruction here at Stuyvesant. Since we have not been mandated to change any curriculum, this unified approach to instruction will not involve us. I fully expect to again focus our attention on providing meaningful instruction for each student on a daily basis in every class.

Finally, I would like to extend a special welcome to our incoming parents. This year should give you an excellent view of the dedication, sense of community, and untiring contributions that are typical of our Stuyvesant community members. I expect to greet many of you personally at the September 23rd Parents' Association meeting.

## P.A. EXECUTIVE POSITIONS TO BE FILLED AT THE SEPTEMBER & OCTOBER MEETINGS

At the beginning of each school year, the Parents' Association elects Members-At-Large from each class, and two School Leadership Team (SLT) Representatives from the freshman class. Nominations are taken from the floor at the September P.A. meeting. The election is held at the October P.A. meeting, following a brief speech by each candidate.

This is a wonderful opportunity to get involved in the P.A. by running for an elected position. There are seven Members-At-Large: one parent from the senior class, one from the junior class, two from the sophomore class, and three from the freshman class.

Members-At-Large represent their grade on the P.A. Executive Board. The Executive Board will now usually meet once a month on the first Tuesday of the month. Meetings generally take place at the school, beginning at 6:15 p.m. and usually end around 8:30 p.m. In addition Members-At-Large are expected to attend the P.A.'s monthly General Meetings, and to be available to speak with parents during the Hospitality half-hour before each meeting. P.A. General Meetings are usually held on the third Tuesday of each month from 7:00 p.m. until about 9:00 p.m. Members-At-Large are also expected to volunteer at various P.A. activities during the year. In addition, they'll now be asked to take full responsibility for gaining feedback from their constituent grades via e-mail or telephone and at meetings

The School Leadership Team (SLT) consists of 10 parents, 5 administrators, 5 teachers and 5 students. The major tasks of the School Leadership Team are development of a Comprehensive Education Plan for the school, development of a budget/staffing plan in support of the Comprehensive Education Plan, and review of the Plan's effectiveness.

The ten parent representatives on the School Leadership Team are: the President of the P.A., two parents from the senior class, three from the junior class, two from the sophomore class, and two from the freshman class. All except the freshman representatives are elected in the spring.

The School Leadership Team has been meeting on the Tuesday matching the Executive Board Meeting, now the first Tuesday, of each month. Meetings are held at the school from about 3:15 p.m. until 5:00 p.m. Additional meetings are sometimes required. Members of the SLT may also serve on sub-committees, which hold separate meetings.

SLT representatives are members of the P.A. Executive Board and are expected to attend Executive Board Meetings, and to be available to speak with parents the half-hour before each P.A. meeting. SLT representatives will now be asked to take full responsibility for gaining feedback from their constituent grades via e-mail or telephone and at meetings.

If you are interested, or you want to nominate someone else who is interested in running for an elected position, please attend the P.A. meeting on September 23 and put that name into nomination. 每年新學年開學時都要選舉各個年級的家長代表以及新任學校領導團隊成員。候選人將在 9 月份的家長大會上產生,並在 10 月份的家長大會上進行選舉。將選出 7 位家長代表。1 位 12 年級家長代表,1 位 11 年級家長代表,2 位 10 年級代表和 3 位 9 年級代表。家長代表將代表他們各自的年級參加家長會執委會會議。

## Guide to Fundraising:

Stuyvesant HS is blessed with many people who want to support the school financially. As a result, and especially in this Stuyvesant Centennial year, you may be contacted for donations from groups other than our Parents' Association. To help you decide whether and to whom you might want to make a donation, we offer the following brief guide to groups that might be asking for contributions. The Stuyvesant High School Parents' Association neither endorses nor discourages your participation in the activities of other groups.

### 1) Stuyvesant HS Parents' Association-

Mainly the Phonathon involving a telephone call seeking a donation after a mailing in May. You may also be asked for a dues donation in the fall, to sustain our operating expenses also. PA collections are used mostly as Wish List grants to the various school departments and student activities and clubs that you vote on at PA meetings. These are basically our only sources of income and are used within the following school year after they are collected. Funds collected by the PA are the only funds whose use is directly controlled by parents of current students. As a rule, PA, does not share your personal information with anyone without your permission, but if you filled out a form or list in the directory, your data is publicized and therefore available. Currently we added a check-off so that you may decide whether to share your data with other fundraisers also, described below.

This is a Non-Profit Community Based Organization (501C3) which was formed in 1999 dedicated to build an "endowment" fund that will provide financial assistance to further the mission of New York City's Stuyvesant High School. Friends of Stuyvesant is a sub-committee of the Centennial Committee which is planning many activities to celebrate the 100th Anniversary of the school. Friends is also collecting funds toward an "endowment" focused on corporate and other funding sources, as well as individuals. Parents and alumni are involved on the Centennial Committee and its Friends of Stuyvesant subcommittee.

\*Endowments 3 & 4- Once established, the purpose of an endowment fund is to generate income that will be used to provide financial assistance to the school. The private group that controls the fund decides how and when income from the fund will be used, but the group may consult with the school administration or other members of the school community for their views. Donations to any of these groups are tax-deductible and intended to benefit the school.

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## Grants for Volunteerism

Did you know that many of the major corporations in the Greater New York City area give cash grants to not-for-profit organizations at which their employees volunteer their time? For example, JPMorgan Chase Bank's volunteer program will award \$1,000 to any qualifying organization, such as our PA, at which a Chase employee has volunteered 100 hours of service within a 12-month period. Other major banks and corporations offer similar programs. If you work for an employer which offers such a program, please consider volunteering your time in order for the PA to qualify for this grant money. All you would need to do is volunteer your time, get the necessary paperwork from your employer and submit it to the PA for processing. American Express and Citicorp have similar programs. If you are not sure whether your employer offers such a program, check your company intranet site or contact your human resources department.

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## World Trade Center Health Registry has been launched!

To parents/guardians of students at Stuyvesant High School:

The World Trade Center Health Registry is being developed in order to understand the possible health consequences related to 9/11. The Registry will contain health information on thousands of people who lived, worked, or attended school near the World Trade Center site on 9/11. Two of the groups that are eligible for the Registry are students who were enrolled in schools (daycare, Pre-K, elementary school, middle school, or high school) south of Canal Street on September 11, 2001 and their parents if they also live south of Canal Street. To enroll call 1-866-NYC-WTCR (1-866-692-9827), for general information call 311, or visit our web site [www.wtcregistry.org](http://www.wtcregistry.org). All interviews of people currently under age 18 will be done by their parent or guardian. You can pre-register yourself or your child by calling any of the numbers above or by visiting the web site. The Registry is being established by the New York City Department of Health and Mental Hygiene and the federal Agency for Toxic Substances and Disease Registry. Thank you for your participation.

### **COLLEGE OFFICE PROCEDURES UPDATE #1**

**TO:** Members of the Class of 2004

**FROM:** Ms. Cleary, College Counselor

**DATE:** August 15, 2003

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I hope you have had a productive and restful summer and are ready for the next stage in the college application process.

To make the delivery of college advisement more effective, we have introduced new procedures which make use of both your Stuyvesant email address and your student account on the Stuyvesant network.

In the past, an SSR Update Sheet was distributed at the Senior Assembly during the first week in September. Near the end of August, this year, an SSR Update data entry form will be available on your Stuyvesant student account. All seniors are required to enter the information which is requested on the SSR Update data entry form and submit the data as soon as it is complete, but NO LATER than September 9th.

In an effort to make your college advisement interview more productive, we have developed a College Selection Worksheet. The data which you provide on this worksheet will help your advisor prepare for your interview and will be used by you and your advisor during your interview. A College Selection Worksheet data entry form will also be available on your student account near the end of August. All seniors are

required to enter the information which is requested on the College Selection Worksheet data entry form and submit the data as soon as it is complete, but NO LATER than September 9th.

We want to ensure that EVERY senior has the opportunity to meet with a college advisor. For this reason, college advisement interviews will be scheduled by the staff in the college office and will begin on September 10th. You will receive an email message which informs you of the name of the advisor to whom you have been assigned as well as the date and time of your appointment. Because college advisors will be conducting scheduled interviews during the months of September and October, they will not be available during the school day to accommodate walk-in requests. During these months, an advisor will be available before school and after school to answer your questions.

When you return to school on September 8, there will be a MANDATORY college assembly. I look forward to meeting with you again and getting off to a great start on our fall activities.
